For 75 years this annual publication has given eighteenth-century scholars a bibliographic overview of the latest research, trends, and thinking in their field for the profiled year. Entries are drawn from books and articles. The contributors and subjects come from Europe, the United States, the United Kingdom, Latin America, and Australia and New Zealand. The majority of the selections are not annotated, but when included, the reviews and commentaries allow better content evaluation. Volume 28 highlights publications from 2002 with a few entries for earlier in the decade. Material is presented in eight major sections: "Printing and Bibliographical Studies"; "Historical, Social, and Economic Studies"; "Philosophy, Science, and Religion"; "Fine Arts"; "Foreign Literatures and Languages"; "British Literatures"; "New World Literatures and Languages"; and "Late Entries and Reviews." There is an index of authors, editors, and reviewers that includes historical figures named in the expanded notes. This reference is fundamental for the serious student of this interesting century and is an impressive ongoing achievement. It is a testament to the researchers in this field that such a significant amount of new work is generated each year.—Adrienne Antink
